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POLITE REMINDERS FOR THE START OF THE NEW YEAR

- Please leave the playground promptly at the end of the day. Our after school clubs are starting soon and children use the playground for clubs. If the playgrounds are not empty, our children cannot start their club.
- Our playground apparatus should not be used at the end of the day.
- We ask all children to walk their bikes and scooters when they are in the playground and not to ride them until they are outside.
- Dogs must be kept outside and not brought onto the playground.
- Please label all jackets, jumpers and water bottles. We are only one week into term and we
 have already collected lots of jumpers and water bottles. It is very difficult to find who they
 belong to if they have not been labelled.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

The start of the year is a good time to remind everyone about our school uniform policy.

It was lovely to see most of our children returning to school wearing the correct school uniform, including black shoes or trainers. However, there are still a small number of children who are not wearing the correct footwear. Children should not be wearing shoes to school which are brightly coloured. School uniform helps to make sure that everyone feels equal and it isn't fair if some children are wearing brightly coloured or expensive trainers to school.

School shoes also need to be suitable for running around and climbing. The children spend a great deal of their time at lunchtime climbing on the apparatus in school. Loose sandals, flip flops and crocs are not suitable for climbing. Please make sure the shoes they are wearing are appropriate.

We do understand that there may be other reasons why your child isn't wearing the correct shoes to school. If that is the case, please let us know. We may be able to help.

Children should not be wearing jewellery to school. The exceptions to this rule are small stud earring or an analogue watch (when children can tell the time).

If your child wears a head scarf, it should be school uniform colours – white, blue or black. Thank you for your support.
