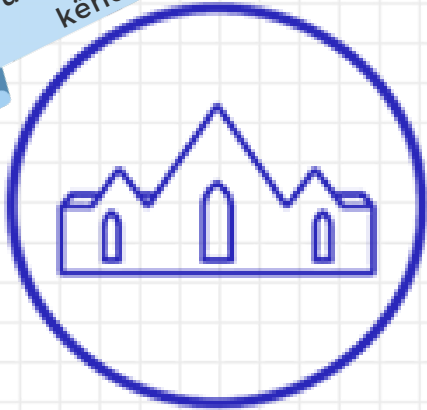

PUNCTUALITY

We would like to emphasise the importance of **being in school on time** as there have been numerous incidents of some families routinely arriving at school after 9.00 a.m.

School starts at 9:00 a.m. every day, with the gates opened at 8:50 a.m. Children need to be in their class so that they can start their lessons promptly. Children who arrive late are greatly disadvantaged because they miss starting the day with their peers and the beginning of lessons. It is also very important that children establish good routines and habits in preparation for the rest of their lives. Punctuality is a life skill that they need to develop whilst they are young.

It is essential that you ensure that your child arrives at school on time to prevent disruption to your child's own learning and that of others. **We are required to monitor children's punctuality and attendance. On-going lateness (after the class register has been taken) is classified as an unauthorised absence and this is contrary to The Education Act.**

We understand that there may be rare occasions when you are unavoidably late due to unforeseen circumstances. On these occasions please make sure that you contact the school office to inform us when you will arrive.

High levels of unauthorised absences or poor punctuality can result in a referral to the Educational Welfare Service or other agencies which have a duty to investigate further and could result in legal action being taken against you.

6AM CLASS ASSEMBLY

POKEMON CARDS

Since the start of the year, we have seen increasing numbers of children bringing Pokémon cards and other collectables into school. What started off with a small number of children bringing these into school, has quickly spread across other year groups. We have noticed that some children are now trading cards, with some of these being quite rare and holding considerable value. We have already begun to see problems in classes and the playground where cards have gone missing, and disagreements have ensued. We had thought about the possibility of providing a space where some groups could be supervised at lunchtimes with their cards, but logistically we do not have the staff to cover this, so we have taken the decision to introduce a ban on bringing cards and collectables into school. TIKTOK & WHATSAPP

We are aware that some children in our school (mostly in Y5 and Y6) are in WhatsApp groups with other children. WhatsApp requires a minimum age of 16. If you decide that your child can use WhatsApp, we ask that you monitor carefully how your child is using it and most importantly, support them to use it safely.

Although most children will be sensible and not post anything inappropriate, occasionally children do post offensive or hurtful comments or share inappropriate images. This can be upsetting for the other children in the group who often will worry about what they have read or seen. Please do make sure if your child has a WhatsApp account, that you talk to them regularly about the conversations they are having online and look at what they are posting.

We also know that increasing numbers of children are using TikTok. This app has an age-rating of 13+. The material that children can view if they use TikTok is NOT appropriate. Despite what our children might tell us, TikTok isn't just a place to watch others lip-synching to popular songs. Children can access all sorts of harmful content on TikTok or share videos of themselves which can be viewed widely by others.

As a school, we know you will all make up your own minds about what is right for your child. If your child has a phone, please make sure you are talking to them regularly about how they are using it and making sure they are safe if they are online. If you need any advice about keeping your child safe online, please do contact us and we can help you. Also, please continue to talk to us if you are concerned by anything you see online that relates to a child at The Winns.
