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HEAD'S MESSAGE

Dear families,

There are lots of great things happening at our school that we love to celebrate. However, today I want to raise some concerns with you about attendance at school. Our overall school attendance is currently 94.6%. This is low compared to other schools nationally. Overall, school attendance should be at least be 96% and we are well below this figure. The local authority are working with us at the moment to improve attendance. We have a statutory responsibility to ensure that all children are attending school and to work with you to address concerns, when they arise.

We know where children are missing school regularly, they often fall behind their peers academically and find it harder to build friendships and to enjoy school. This isn't okay for any child and can have a serious impact on their life chances going forward.

If your child's attendance is currently below 95.5%, we will be writing to you over the next week to let you know that your child's attendance is lower than it should be. There may be reasons why this has happened, i.e. a long period of illness. If this is the case, and your child's attendance is improving, we will simply continue to monitor your child's attendance and hopefully will see improvements. However, if your child is regularly absent we will be working with the local authority over the Summer term to explore the reasons for this and to work with you to ensure that your child is in school.

Please remember that we can only authorise absence in very exceptional circumstances. Some families are still requesting permission to take their child out of school for holidays or to return to their home country. Any unauthorised leave for a period of time will most likely result in you being issued with a fixed penalty notice fine for each child and could also result in you losing your child's place in school.

Some of you may not be aware that if your child arrives after the register has closed, this is recorded as an absence. Regular lateness will be impacting on your child's attendance.

Approximately 15-20% of the population has a neurological difference. 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END OF DAY COLLECTION

If your child is being collected by someone else at the end of the day, please make sure you let us know. If we haven't been informed, teachers will ask you to wait until they are able to call you and check that you have given permission for this to happen. Please do understand that this will take some time and the person picking up your child will need to wait until the other children have been dismissed.

There are a number of ways you can let us know about changes:

- In Reception and Year 1, please let the teacher know in the morning when you are dropping off your child.
- If you are not able to speak to the teacher, please send an email to the school office as soon
 as you can. Although we understand that sometimes changes need to be made at the last
 minute, please try to avoid sending emails towards the end of the day this is a very busy
 time in the school office.
- You can also telephone the school office and let the office staff know. Again, please try to avoid doing this towards the end of the school day.

If you regularly use someone else to pick up your child, eg another parent or relative, please let the class teacher know. If a relative or friend is regularly collecting your child, please introduce them to us so we know who they are. Once we know that this is a regular arrangement, you don't need to contact us each time to let us know.




