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NEW SCHOOL YEAR, NEW SCHOOL LOGO

We are delighted to be able to share with you our new school logo. Last year we worked with our governors, staff, children and community to review our school vision. The final piece of this project was to agree a new logo for our wonderful school. After lots of discussion and debate, we have finally arrived at a consensus.



Our school vision is underpinned by four pillars: **Belonging**, **Exploring**, **Growing and Achieving**.

We chose a 'strong' traditional type W to represent the fact that The Winns has been a hugely important part of our community for a very long time. Our school has been here for approximately 125 years. During this time, it has been a safe, happy space for thousands of children and we want to make sure our school continues to be a great community school, with strong community roots – a school where everyone feels they belong.

Our plant represents Growth. We want all our children to grow in confidence and selfbelief and to leave us as kind, curious and confident young people who love learning and care about the world around them. As a community we want to continue growing too, trying new things, challenging ourselves and continuing to grow as a school.

Our bee captures all sorts of things! When we talk to our children about our bee, we talk about the importance of bees and how, just like these wonderful creatures, we too are really important. We talk about working together like bees and we talk about the 'buzz' we feel from learning new things. Like bees, we want to explore, be curious and like bees to a flower, make learning irresistible for our children.

OUR VISION IN ACTION

Belonging – our fantastic Reception children have all started and have been very busy making new friends and getting to know their teachers. So lovely to see new friendships blossoming so quickly. **Growing** - Y1 children have been settling into a new hall and exploring the rest of the 'big' school. Moving from Reception to Year 1 is a big step. This week, we have all been so impressed with how well they have settled into a new part of the school and how confident they seem.

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OUR VISION IN ACTION

Exploring - this week, all our Y3 children started learning to play the piano. They will have two lessons each week and they all looked very excited about learning a new skill.

Achieving – great to see so many of our children excited about reading this week. Library visits were very popular and we have a constant stream of children choosing new books. We know that children who read lots achieve well – a great start!

REMINDERS FOR START OF THE YEAR

We ask that children from Y3 - Y6 come into school independently in the morning and parents drop them off at the gates.

At the end of the day, please leave the playground as soon as you have collected your child/children. Children should not be playing on the apparatus or playing football in the playground. Clubs start running again next week and the playground needs to be clear so we can start our clubs promptly.

A very small number of children are continuing not to wear school uniform to school. Please ensure your child is wearing correct uniform and shoes. It isn't fair on the other children who are doing the right thing. Please do let us know if you need any support with school uniform. Please speak to Allison Tokeley who may be able to help.

Do keep an eye on our school website for dates and key information.

Our office is a very busy place, particularly at the start of the new year. If you need to change arrangements around pick-up, we ask that you contact the office as soon as you can so we can message teachers.

We were delighted to welcome Howard and Oscar into school again on Wednesday morning to showcase the ukulele and guitar across KS1 and KS2. Lots of our children already receive ukulele or guitar tuition from Front Row Music, with many of them performing their instruments in our Summer Musical Showcase at the end of last term. 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FREE SCHOOL MEALS

All children in KS2 are now able to have free school meals. We have had a huge increase in numbers which is great to see. However, the logistics of managing dinner time have become more complex, as we are having to provide more hot meals every day.

Going forward, we can no longer change school dinner arrangements on a weekly basis. Once you have agreed the days your child is having school dinner, we ask that you only make changes at the start of a new half term.

URGENT

HAVE YOU APPLIED FOR FREE SCHOOL MEALS?

Some of you might wonder why you need to do this if your child is now not having to pay for dinner. There is a huge risk to school budgets if parents who are entitled to free school meals do not complete a free school meal application. Schools receive a significant amount of funding for children who are entitled to free school meals. This money (called Pupil Premium money) is used to subsidise trips, pay for additional support for children and help families in need. If families who are entitled to FSMs no longer apply, the school will lose out on this funding. We will only receive this money if families have completed their application before the end of September.

What to do next

If you are receiving any benefits, including income support and universal tax credit, and you have not applied in the past year, <u>please complete the online application for FSMs</u> or come into school and talk to Allison Tokeley who can support you with the application. We are making a particular call out to families of children who were in Rec, Y1 and Y2 last year – if you haven't applied, please do so. If your circumstances have changed and you are now receiving benefits, please apply.

Benefits, including :

- · Income support
- · Universal Credit
- · Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance

To encourage new families to apply, we will be giving every family who hasn't already applied, a £25 supermarket voucher if they apply between now and the end of September and are successful in their application. Just bring in your code or email saying you were successful, and we will give you a voucher. Please note this does not include families who have already applied and are receiving Free School Meals.

If you think you might be entitled, please do apply. The process is very easy and it only takes minutes. See Allison Tokeley if you need any help with the process. She can be contacted on <u>allison.tokeley@winns.waltham.sch.uk</u> or through the school office.


September is . . . back to school routines

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INFINITY BREATHING

You and your child may be going through a lot of change this week by returning to school or even starting a new school. Breathing exercises is one of the best tools to reduce anxiety.

Using your finger, slowly follow the line of the infinity loop. Take a deep breath in as your finger follows the right hand side, then breathe out as your finger follows the left hand side. Aim to take 3 to 4 seconds to complete each half of the loop. Repeat this loop 7 times, focusing on your finger as you do so.
