## To develop our literacy skills this half term children will be learning to identify which sounds correspond to which letters. Children will be writing their names and using sounds to spell and sound out words. To support your child at home please practise writing their names beginning with a capital letter followed by lower case letters.

In Reception we will be using Read Write Inc to support and develop children's knowledge and understanding of Phonics. We want to promote a lifelong love of reading and inspire our children with a range of books and stories. To support your child at home please try to read for pleasure with them daily. Reading books will be sent home later this term.

Communication and Language are at the heart of learning in Reception, we want all our children to feel confident communicating and expressing themselves. In Reception we will be developing communication skills by asking questions, modelling language and extending vocabulary. At home you can support your child's language by looking at pictures and asking questions and extending your child's vocabulary.

As part of our Art & Design learning we will start the term by creating self-portraits. We will look at ourselves noticing our unique features. We will mix our own colours and draw attention to the different shapes we can see. We will focus on fine motor skills such as using scissors and pencil control. Creativity is embedded in the EYFS curriculum and at the heart of everything we do.


