P.E

In this half term, children will be focusing on Tag Rugby and Badminton. In Tag Rugby, pupils will develop key skills and principles such as defending, attacking, throwing, catching, running and dodging. In Badminton, pupils focus on developing the skills they need to play continuous rallies in badminton. They will learn about the ready position, racket control, serving and hitting over a net and how to use these skills to make the game difficult for their opponent.

PE lessons take place twice a week. If your child uses deodorant this needs to be a roll-on rather than a spray deodorant.

Design and Technology

Children will be designing and creating a model of a new playground. Children will learn how to visualise objects in plan view before creating their own structural designs. Their playground designs will feature five apparatus and these will be made from three different structures.

Homework Days: Maths homework set every Friday. This will always be due the following Tuesday.

Reading: Year 6 will be taking out new books for home every Wednesday from the school library. They are encouraged to read 20 minutes every day.

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Science

This half term the children will explore the function of the human circulatory system. Furthermore, they will examine the role of the heart, blood vessels and the components of blood. An analysis of how our pulse rate responds to exercise will be conducted with a scientific reflection on this using data. They will also look to develop their understanding of the impact of diet, exercise, drugs and lifestyle on health.

Geography

In Geography the children will learn about **Globalisation** and the process by which the world is becoming increasingly interconnected as a result of massively increased trade and cultural exchange. They will learn about the production of goods and services and how the biggest companies are no longer national firms but multinational corporations with subsidiaries in many countries.

How to support your children at home

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English

Children will be focusing on short story writing with a particular emphasis on the works of Paul Jennings. Children will use expanded noun phrases to describe things, people and places using adventurous adjectives, adverbs and smiles. They will use clauses at the start of and within their sentences and punctuate them with commas, dashes, semi-colons and colons

Maths

Following the work the children have undertaken on the four main operations in the previous term, they will now be exposed to a wide range of reasoning word problems, where these operations need to be used and applied accurately.

Furthermore, the children will continue to deepen their understanding of decimals through ordering and comparing. Reading and interpreting data will also be explored and strengthened. Fractions will start to be revisited with an emphasis on arithmetic as well as their use in reasoning activities.

Computing

The children will follow their learning about the history of Bletchley Park and how coding was developed by investigating and exploring historical figures who have made significant contributions to the world of computing. Following their own research they will then look to create a presentation on their chosen historical figure.

PSHE

In this half term, children will be learning about human conception and reproduction. They will develop further knowledge about the male and female reproductive organs and understand the different ways adults can have children. They will study the different stages of pregnancy and identify the laws around consent.

Assessment

For both Literacy and Maths we will continue to carry out regular in-class assessments in order to identify areas where additional work and booster groups are needed. The aim is for all children to be 'secondary ready' with the skills they need to develop and thrive. In relation to this, we want all children to be as best prepared as possible for their SATS exams which are on the 13th May.

MFL

This half term the children will develop their speaking and listening skills; asking and responding to questions about football as well as working on their written French by adapting football player profiles. The children will also explore the use of different languages in Christmas songs.

Music

This part of the autumn term will be focused around learning and rehearsing a range of international Christmas songs for our Christmas performance on the 15th December.
