However, we are becoming increasingly concerned about the number of children (and adults) who are walking in the road. The road is not pedestrianised. Residents, parents and visitors who have a disability are able to drive in and out. We have observed that some drivers do not take due care and on occasions we have witnessed drivers travelling at speed along the road. Please make sure your child is walking on the footpath and they understand that cars do still drive along our streets.
