

MESSAGE FROM THE HEADTEACHER

Dear families.

It's half term (again, I hear some of you say!). A massive thank you to all our families who have supported us this week in our fundraising playground campaign. We really do appreciate all your support and generosity. We are on track to build our playground over the Summer holidays and the children are very excited. We have heard some wonderful stories about the creative ways children are doing their own fundraising out of school. One child set up his own fresh lemonade and tomato plant stall on his doorstep and donated all funds raised to school. Another child made 30 bracelets to sell to family members. Young entrepreneurs of the future, no doubt! I also know that 'behind the scenes' our wonderful FOTWs are busy preparing for the Summer Fair with all proceeds going towards our new playground. This week has been a particularly busy one in school. Just this morning, I spotted children Y3 and Y4 taking part in some really exciting dance workshops, Y6 were enjoying having a visit from our favourite storyteller, CJ, who was working with them to develop their creative writing, Y2 were busy cooking in the kitchen and Y5 were working with our artist, Helen. WELL DONE TEACHERS, CHILDREN AND PARENTS!

The day consisted of an interactive assembly and follow up workshops, providing a safe and creative opportunity to introduce sensitive issues and subject matter, as well as an excellent starting point for future conversations about choices and consequences. These are important messages that we want our Y6 children to take away as they prepare to move to secondary school in September.






