The nursery is organised into key groups, allowing your child's key worker to gain a full understanding of their development and interests. All staff members are dedicated to caring for and teaching your child, however, a key worker will ensure that each child receives the personalised teaching and support needed to reach their full potential. Key workers foster a warm and trusting relationship with your child during their time with us.

You will be invited to a parents' meeting with your child's key worker twice a year, and you will receive a school report at the conclusion of your child's time here.

Our nursery provides a variety of session times to accommodate your needs: morning, afternoon, full day sessions and wrap around care.

15-Hour Provision

30-Hour Provision

Monday to Thursday: 8:45 AM - 3:30 PM AND Friday: 8:45 AM - 11:45 AM Additional session is available on Friday afternoons for a fee.

Extended Day and Wrap Around Care


Our Nursery Breakfast Club operates Monday-Friday 7.30-8.45. Wrap around provision operates Monday-Thursday. Parents can choose wrap around care from 3.15-5.15 OR 3.15-5.55. The wrap around care will take place in Yellow Hall. See our Nursery Admissions Policy for further details and fees.



The Importance of Play in the Early Years

At the Winns, we believe that high quality play must sit at the heart of our curriculum. Our children are immersed in a rich and varied play provision which includes:

sand and water play
messy play
open-ended role play building stories and imaginary worlds
sensory play
large and small scale construction play

creative opportunites through art and music
investigative play
stroytelling
drawing, mark making, letter and number writing
early number skills and mathematical problem solving

How we support learning

We believe that children thrive in their learning when it combines both child-led exploration and adult-guided instruction. They are given ample opportunities to pursue their interests through independent play, alongside engaging in focused activities that align with the Development Matters guidance and the foundational principles of the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS). Our extensive outdoor area allows for continuous provision, ensuring that learning can take place both indoors and outdoors, regardless of the weather.

Physical play and construction projects
Creative learning through messy play, water, sand, and arts and crafts

Settling in

Supporting Your Child's First Days at Nursery

We are here to guide you and your child during their initial days and weeks at nursery. Starting nursery can be an emotional experience for both parents and children. We completely understand this and want to provide you with reassurance, ensuring open communication is a priority for us.

A Smooth Transition

In the first few days, we welcome groups of children into their new environment to facilitate a smooth and relaxed start. We recognise that while some children adapt quickly, others may take a bit longer to feel comfortable in a new setting.

On your child's first day, parents are welcome to stay and play with their child for approximately the first 20 minutes upon arrival. However, in the following days, we kindly ask that you say goodbye to your child at the door. We understand this can be challenging, but children often find transitions easier when parents leave promptly. Rest assured, we will contact you if your child becomes upset and needs assistance settling in.

Ongoing Support

In the months that follow, we continue to support each child's individual needs by fostering strong bonds and positive relationships. We are always available to discuss any concerns or answer your questions at the end of the day or via email at nursery@winns.waltham.sch.uk. We will hold our first parent-teacher meeting at the end of the first half-term.

Tapestry



The nursery uses the Tapestry app to share learning experiences and play with parents, capturing key moments. You will receive the login information via email once your child begins attending nursery.



It is essential for children to wear comfortable, easily manageable, and **clearly labeled clothing** to nursery. Here are a few key points:

Clothing should be appropriate for an active nursery day, as messy play and physical activities are likely.

All items must be labeled very clearly.

Velcro shoes are the best option.

As we are expecting children to use the toilet independently, please choose clothing that helps toileting, such as elastic-waisted trousers that are easy to pull up and down. Please speak to your child's key worker for any support.

Long hair should be tied back, in accordance with school policy.

No jewellery is allowed, except for stud earrings.

Please provide your child with spare clothing in a **clearly labeled** small drawstring or plastic bag. This bag will be stored in the nursery for any accidents. If your child has had a change of clothes, kindly remember to replenish the spare set.

Toys

Although we understand that children may find comfort in bringing a favorite toy during the settling-in period, we kindly ask that they **do not** bring in toys, dummies, or comforters. Our nursery is equipped with fantastic toys and resources, and personal items from home can often become lost or damaged.

Sickness and Accidents

Sickness

Please ensure that your child stays at home if they are unwell. After experiencing vomiting or diarrhea, wait <u>48 hours</u> from the last episode before returning to nursery.

If your child feels unwell while at nursery, we will contact you by phone so they can go home.

Reports of Accidents

In the event of an accident, you will receive a text message informing you that your child has been attended to by one of our first aiders. If your child sustains a bump to the head, they will be given a red band to wear on their wrist.

Pick Up, Drop Off and Attendance

Please ensure that your child arrives on time and is picked up promptly. The nursery gate will be open from 8:45 to 8:55 AM for morning arrivals, and for afternoon children, the gate opens at 12:30 PM.

The beginning of the day is crucial for all children. Arriving late can be unsettling for your child and disrupts the nursery's daily routine. If you do arrive late, you will need to take your child to the school office, where a member of the office staff will escort them to the nursery. Please remember that children in nursery must be dropped off and picked up by a responsible adult (nobody under 16years old).

If you have made arrangements for someone else to collect your child, please inform the nursery staff or email either the nursery or the school office. We cannot release children to an unfamiliar person without your prior permission.

In case of an emergency that may cause you to be late at the end of the day, please contact the school office as soon as possible.

If your child cannot attend nursery for any reason, it is essential to notify us by completing the 'Report an Absence' form available on the homepage of the school website.



School Meals and Snacks

Children have the option to bring a packed lunch from home or opt for a school meal, which is priced at £2.59 per day (subject to change). School meals are prepared on-site, and the menu is available on the school website. Lunches are served in the Red Hall.

Guidelines for Packed Lunches:

If your child brings a packed lunch, please ensure it is healthy and well-balanced, avoiding sugary drinks, chocolate, and sweets.

Grapes should be cut in half lengthwise to reduce the risk of choking.

Nuts and seeds must not be included in packed lunches due to serious allergies among some children at the school.

It is helpful to label your child's lunch box with their <u>full name</u>.

For children participating in wrap-around care, they will need a labeled snack box in addition to packed school lunch.

Snacks:

During the nursery day, we will provide a healthy snack of fruit or vegetables and milk.
