Despite the pull of the online world, when we talk to our children about what they really enjoy doing, they tell us that they love being outside, in the park or going for a cycle, they love reading, cooking, playing with Lego or just watching a good movie together as a family. Things that don't cost very much but just require the often hard to find 'Time'. Hopefully, we can all find some of this over the break.

On behalf of all our staff team at The Winns, we hope you all have a wonderful break, are able to rest, see family and enjoy time together. We look forward to seeing everyone back in school on Tuesday 6th January.





Y2 ARTIST WORKSHOP

Year 2 brought history to life during our Great Fire of London workshop! The children layered coloured paper to create layers of fire that they added to a street mural, before later adding effective silhouette figures that they drew using a step-by-step shape technique to build body parts.

We're excited to promote a set of Waltham Forest walks that highlight the rich history, hidden nature and vibrant community life of the area.

Together, these routes celebrate the community's commitment to sustainability, heritage, and cultural enrichment, providing engaging experiences for locals and visitors alike.

Share these walks with your school community to encourage them to be more active and explore their local area over the festive period!

Waterside Walkabout: This route takes you along the River Lea and Tottenham Marshes, showcasing Walthamstow Wetlands, an internationally significant nature reserve. It also includes a visit to the William Morris Gallery, a museum dedicated to the famed designer.

Mosey on the Marsh: Explore the green spaces of the Lea Valley, including Ive Farm Community Garden and the Christopher Robbins Woodland Walk. Highlights include Friends Bridge, steeped in history as a former boundary between Anglo-Saxon England and Viking Danelaw.

Walthamstow Village Walk: Celebrating 10 years of the Sustainable Transport program, this walk features Walthamstow Market, the longest outdoor street market in Europe, the soon-to-be-reopened Soho Theatre, and St. Mary's Church with its new arts focus.


