
WATERSTONES CHILDREN'S BOOK PRIZE FILMING

THE WINNS STORY WINDOWS TRAIL 2026

We're delighted to announce that the Winns Story Windows Trail will be back in 2026, as one of the many fantastic activities taking place at the school throughout March to celebrate World Book Day.

We're also incredibly grateful to **Central Estate Agents** for coming on board as our annual book trail sponsor. This year, they're pledging **£1,000 towards new books for the school if we reach our target of 100 homes** hosting a Central Estate Agents sign during the period 1-31 March.

The trail is an activity organised by Friends of The Winns (FOTW), where children and carers sign up to **decorate a panel in their front window**, inspired by their favourite book or book character.



Winns families can also sign up to **host a sponsored sign**, which helps raise funds for the school and promotes the event.

All families can take part in the trail by using the Google Map of decorated homes, which will be created and shared throughout March.
